Strata Lawyers Dissect Anti-Airbnb Laws

It's widely accepted that holiday lets have a more profound effect on apartment blocks than stand-alone dwellings, for obvious reasons.

Late last year, the <u>Privy Council in London ruled</u> on a piece of overseas strata legislation that was basically a cut-and-paste of NSW strata law, section 139 (2), which says that bylaws can't interfere with owners letting their units.

Adrian Mueller of JS Mueller & Co says that rather than a bylaw restricting the number of days a property could be let I would... "Advise the owners corporation to make a new by-law that would prohibit an owner or occupier of a lot using the lot ... for unlawful short-term accommodation".
